Stock Market Challenge (SMC) 2018 Kick Off Dinner Thursday January 18, 6:30 PM

SMC is our club's main fund raiser to support all our projects and donations toward area youth. It declined from our high 400 past participants and then 2017 we started to pick back up to 254. Please help us to increase sales again. Help get the flyers out. Then please participate by selling tickets to friends and buying a \$20 ticket—or 2 or 3 yourself! It's fun to guess which stocks will rise in two months. Will your chosen five stocks win the big prize of \$750? Or consolation last place \$20? Or somewhere in between!

SMC 2018 kicks off at the club's dinner meeting on Thursday, January 18. Members will enjoy dinner and then prepare the SMC 2018 packets that will be mailed to 400 people who have participated in the last three years.

Each SMC participant will select five different stocks from the list of 52 stocks on the entry form which will then be set up in a portfolio with \$2,000 of each of their five stocks for a total portfolio value of \$10,000, based on stock prices at the close of the markets on Friday, February 28, 2014. The SMC is a competition to see whose portfolios perform the best over the months of March and April. Sixteen financial prizes from \$750 to \$10 will be awarded at the midpoint (5) and at the end (11).

The SMC is a simulation and no money is invested in stocks. SMC participants are actually making a donation supporting GJOC's youth and community activities

The postmark deadline for SMC 2018 entries is Wednesday, February 28, 2018. SMC 2018 will run from Thursday, March 1 through Monday, April 30, 2018.

Now is the time to make a list of people you would like to invite to participate. We have less than six weeks to collect the entries. Postmarked 2/28/19 means just that—not sitting in a post box that mail doesn't get picked up until the next day. Last year we sent 6 entries back—that's \$120 we lost for our community.
