A portfolio was made with \$2,000 for each of their five stocks for a total value of \$10,000, based on stock prices at the close of the markets on February 28. The SMC is a competition to see whose portfolios perform the best



over the months of March and April. Sixteen financial prizes from \$600 to \$10 will be awarded with five at midpoint and 11 at final.
