GJOC Aluminum Cans and Tabs Add Up to Big Dollars for The Optimist Childhood Cancer Campaign!

Aluminum cans and tabs are a major source of revenue for the Optimist Childhood Cancer Campaign in the Maryland South Delaware District of Optimist International. Since April 2004, Optimists in our District have recycled over 7,000 pounds of cans and tabs raising over

\$8,000 for the Optimist Childhood Cancer Campaign. Over 900 pounds of those cans and pull tabs were collected by the Greater Jacksonville Optimist Club.

Adam Drescher and a pickup truck load of bags of cans ready to be recycled is shown on page one. There were 330 pound of cans in those bags. They were collected for us at Fallston High School in a project chaired by Ariel Zhao, a 2005 HOBY Ambassador and winner of our Club's 2006 Essay Contest. Ariel learned about the Optimist CCC recycling project at the 2005 HOBY seminar where she met Dennis Lane, our Club's CCC Chair, and followed up with the students and community collecting cans during the month of April 2006. Their cans generated a donation of \$429 for the CCC. Thank you Ariel and Fallston High school students, staff, and community.

We receive cans and tabs from the Red Cross Blood Donor Center in Lutherville every week and several of our members collect cans and tabs and drop them off at our meetings.
