



MEMBERSHIP

New members pay a one time \$30.00 initiation fee plus a prorated portion of the annual membership dues. First year dues are based on the quarter during which the member joins--Oct.-Dec.: \$30.00 + \$45.00 = 75.00; Jan.-Mar.: \$30.00 + 30.00 = 60.00; Apr.-June: \$30.00 + 15.00 = 45.00; and July-Sept.: \$30.00 + 60.00 = 90.00 which includes the next year's dues in full. Spouses' annual dues are \$30.00. After the first year, dues are payable by October 1.
