
Villa Maria School provides education and treatment for emotionally disturbed children age 3-14. The school offers comprehensive special education and therapeutic services on two campuses in Baltimore County and one in western Baltimore City. Academic instruction and behavioral treatment is highly structured and individualized.

Working with Villa Maria Staff, each student listed the gifts they would like for Christmas and then volunteers purchased the gifts for them and delivered the unwrapped gifts to the School.
